

Pupil Premium Report for Wigmore Primary School 2014-2015

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. The children of Service Personnel are also eligible. This year, children who have been eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years were also included in the Pupil Premium allocation (known as the Ever 6 measure).

We currently have 179 pupils on roll at the Primary school, 16% of whom qualify for Pupil Premium funding (2013-2014 = 13%) Our Pupil Premium allocation for 2014-2015 was **£34,758 (+ £1500)** Our allocation for 2015-2016 is £31,680. Pupil premium funding is used for targeted support to raise attainment and to ensure that all pupils reach their potential both academically and socially. This year, the funding has been spent on the following:
