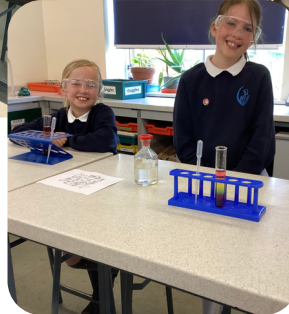

Acorn Class

Acorn Class have had a wonderful week full of exciting learning experiences! On Thursday, the children had a brilliant time visiting the farm. They loved feeding the cows and were fascinated to meet the pigs, chickens, and some very special ducklings who were recently found abandoned under a car. The children showed lots of care and curiosity as they learned about how animals are looked after. Today, the class had a fabulous time creating a dead hedge as part of our celebrations for Sir David Attenborough's 100th birthday. The children worked together carefully and showed fantastic teamwork while learning about nature and habitats. Well done, Acorn Class, for another fantastic week of learning!

Oak Class

Another amazing week in Oak Class! We had a wonderful morning visiting the farm on Thursday. The children really enjoyed looking at all the animals and feeding the cows! In English, we have been continuing our story maps for the story 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. In maths, Reception children have been exploring 3D shapes and discussing which shapes make the best towers. Year 1 children have also been investigating 2D and 3D shapes. We had a great time at the high school on Wednesday looking at the animals and a wonderful PE lesson on Thursday exploring different games.

Elm Class

What a wonderful week in Elm Class! We have started writing diary entries from the perspective of Florence Nightingale and the children have demonstrated what incredible knowledge they have of the kinds of challenges she faced when she arrived at the hospital in Scutari. We have also been learning about money in maths and thinking about the best strategies to count pounds and pence. On Wednesday, we had a fantastic time at the High School learning about all of their animals. Some children were incredibly courageous and held several of the animals, including Giant African snails, baby stick insects and even a corn snake! Have a lovely weekend!

Laurel Class

Laurel Class have had a fantastic week! In English, the children have been analysing example firework poems and have created some wonderful onomatopoeia and simile sentences to describe fireworks! In maths, the children have continued to explore the relationship between parts and wholes as part of our fractions lessons. During science this week, Laurel Class had an amazing visit to the high school and even completed their own chemical reactions! In geography, the children have further developed their knowledge of land use and how Wigmore has changed over time. In PE, the children had a fabulous time developing their golf skills through golf rounders! Another brilliant week for Laurel Class! I hope you all have a wonderful weekend!

Willow Class

A busy, enjoyable week in Willow Class. In English, the children have begun exploring balanced arguments. They have been learning what a balanced argument is and how to recognise both sides of an issue, helping them to understand different viewpoints. In maths, our focus has been on money. The children have been recognising how many pence are in different amounts and learning how to write money correctly using pounds and pence. During PE, the children used their running skills to practise the 100-metre race on the track and in Music, the children learned the notes C and A and used them to accompany the song "Green Green Grass" by George Ezra. On Wednesday morning, the children had an exciting visit to the high school science labs, where they conducted a range of experiments using chemicals. Have a lovely weekend.

Cherry Class

We have had a wonderful, slightly shorter, week in Cherry Class. In English, we have been analysing Neville Chamberlain's declaration of war speech and creating a bank of emotive vocabulary to describe how people may have felt during the outbreak of World War Two. In athletics, the children focussed on jumping partaking in activities including long jump, high jump and hurdles. We had another super forest school session where Cherries made some beautiful flower dye butterflies and toasted marshmallows over the fire to make smores...yum! 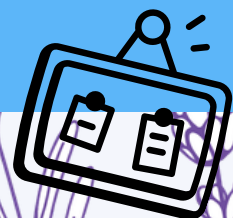
