What's happened at Wigmore...



Acorn Class

This week the children have loved exploring a brand-new adventure in the Amazon rainforest. They've been learning about life beneath the canopy, discovering colourful birds, cheeky monkeys and towering trees through stories like Monkey Puzzle, jungle role play and small-world play. Our taste buds travelled too as the children helped prepare simple Mexican dishes, exploring fresh ingredients, practising safe chopping and enjoying the smells of herbs, spices and coconut. In maths, we focused on measure, using language such as tall, long, short and small, with lots of fun measuring each other on the playground. In phonics, the children practised recognising and sounding the letter l. We hope your little monkeys have a wonderful weekend. **Please remember to send named hats into nursery so children can play outside safely.**

Oak Class

What an amazing week in Oak Class! We have continued our learning about the story 'Mr Wolf's Pancakes'. The children have really enjoyed retelling the story and have written some wonderful letters to Mr Wolf about the events in the story. In maths, Reception children have been exploring the composition of 6, 7, 8 and 9. Year 1 children have been learning number facts within ten using a tens frame. We had a great science lesson on Monday looking for different plants and a lovely PE lesson on Thursday exploring different movements. Have a great weekend!

Elm Class

What a wonderful week in Elm Class! The children have made an incredible start to retelling the story of 'The Lost Robot' but from the robot's perspective and the vocabulary they have been using has blown me away. Year 2s have made a great start to learning about fractions and enjoyed a fraction hunt earlier in the week. We have also enjoyed starting our new topic in history which is all about Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. Elm Class were fantastic representatives for our school during their first swimming lesson on Tuesday and enjoyed practising naming parts of the body in science! Have a lovely weekend!

Laurel Class

Laurel Class have had another wonderful week! In English, the children have been writing some amazing newspaper reports! In maths, the children have been exploring the relationships between the two, four and eight times tables and have enjoyed learning about perimeter. In geography, Laurel Class have been learning about some cities and counties in the UK and they now can list some different types of settlements. On Tuesday, the children had a fabulous time in the glorious sunshine participating in their first tri-golf lesson! During our science lesson this week, Laurel Class have enjoyed learning about some of the different bones in the human body. Another fantastic week for Laurel Class! I hope you all have the very best weekend!

Willow Class

This week, the children have been busy learning across a range of subjects. In English, we focused on using fronted adverbials for time, learning how to begin sentences with time adverbials followed by a comma. We also practised using inverted commas to show direct speech, applying this skill when writing a diary entry. In maths, we began our learning on fractions, exploring parts and wholes by dividing shapes into equal sections. In geography, the children enjoyed creating models of rivers, identifying and labeling key features such as the source and mouth. In French, we learned how to say and recognise the months of the year, practising pronunciation and recall through speaking activities. Have a great weekend

Cherry Class

We have had a super week in Cherry Class. At the beginning of the week, we started writing newspaper reports based on 'Operation Pied Piper', the mass evacuation of thousands of children in 1939. We looked carefully at images to help identify key items evacuees took with them and how children and parents felt during this time. In maths we have been continuing to explore decimal, percentage and fraction equivalents and have been starting to learn how to find a percentage of an amount. We enjoyed another great forest school where the Cherries helped Mrs Jones plant some wild seeds, as well as building dens, tree climbing and mud painting.

Sycamore Class

This week in Sycamore, the children have been developing their knowledge of the properties of shape in mathematics, alongside revising the four operations to strengthen their reasoning skills. In English, we have been revising key grammatical terminology, including conjunctions, pronouns and clauses and phrases. It has been great to see the children growing in confidence when discussing and applying these concepts. The children also enjoyed taking part in a cricket session with Mrs Jones - showing enthusiasm and teamwork - and have continued to develop their understanding of where energy comes from in geography. School Dinners - Please remember to ring the School Canteen to cancel school dinners if your child is off poorly. School dinners need to be on Arbor by Tuesday for the following week.

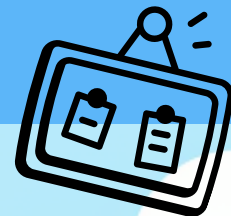
